



# ART & ARCHITECTURE SUMMER AT PENN

The University of Pennsylvania School of Design offers a four-week intensive studio program in art and architecture.

Art students choose major courses and two-week project minors. Architecture students follow a full-day studio intensive every day and do not study a minor.

Working with Penn faculty and

students from around the world, you will experiment with different disciplines, learn new skills, and build your portfolio. The curriculum is taken from regular Penn courses and is sequenced and paced for the age and experience of the students. Classes are small to encourage close interaction between teachers and students.

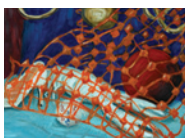
